Juliana spent most of her childhood suffering severe abuse and neglect before entering the foster care system, where she remained until aging out.

Juliana aspires to use her experiences before, during and after foster care to influence and change the lives of others impacted by the system and is most passionate about addressing the health inequities that she and many system-involved children experience. She is an active advocate for the foster care community, including serving as a member of ACTION Ohio, the statewide voice of foster care alumni, and is a student coordinator for Columbus State Scholar Network, a peer support group for former foster youth pursuing higher education.



Most recently, Juliana was appointed by Ohio Governor Mike DeWine to the Children Services Transformation Advisory Council, which is tasked with reviewing and developing recommendations for Ohio's child welfare system.

Juliana currently resides in Columbus, Ohio, where she is a premedical student working toward combining her two passions – medicine and child welfare.
